RECENT WAREHAM POLICE ACTIVITY

As the result of a Wareham Police investigation, three Wareham residents have been arrested and charged with several offenses related to the theft of used automobile parts from Robertson's Auto Salvage in Wareham.

On the morning of Jan. 14, 2010, the owners of Robertson's auto salvage at 2680 Cranberry Hwy. called Wareham Police to report that approximately 80 used aluminum automobile rims had been stolen sometime during the overnight hours. The rims were valued at \$2,300.00. Also taken was approximately \$2,000.00 in stereo equipment

An investigation by Wareham Police Detectives led them to a scrap yard in Westport Mass. where the stolen items were located. Further investigation led them to the arrest of Steven Foss, d.o.b. 09/15/81 of #20 Wareham Lake Shore Drive, Frank A. Sylvester, d.o.b. 07/23/69, of #244 Plymouth Ave, and Troy Jones, d.o.b. 10/20/79 of 4 Benjamin St.

All three have been charged with Receiving stolen property over \$250.00. Additionally, Mr. Foss has been charged with possession of a small amount of illegal drugs. They were arrested on Jan 15, 2010 and were arraigned at Wareham 4th District Court.

All of the items taken from Robertson's have been returned to the business owners by Wareham Detectives.

All three individuals are well known to the Wareham Police and have lengthy criminal records.

In an unrelated incident, Laura Millet, d.o.b. 12/07/84 was arrested by Wareham Police on Jan 19, 2010 and charged with receiving stolen property over \$250.00. Wareham police patrol officers investigated a break and entry into a Wareham residence on Jan 15, 2010.

The homeowner reported two ornamental brass deer were taken valued at approximately \$1000.00. An investigation by Wareham Police Detectives led them to a scrap dealer in New Bedford where surveillance video led them to Ms. Millet and the stolen deer. The two deer have been returned to the owner.

Ms. Millet was arraigned at Wareham District Court and is awaiting a future court date.

On Tuesday evening, Jan. 19, 2010 at approximately 7:30 p.m, Wareham Police received a report that there was a male party with a gun near the Who Lun restaurant at 172 Main St. When police arrived, they spoke with four male parties who said they had just been robbed at gunpoint by two black males. Two of the individuals reported being robbed of an undetermined amount of cash. The victims refused to cooperate with police and would not provide police with any additional information when questioned. Wareham Police Detectives are pursuing several leads and are continuing their investigation.
