An investigation by the Wareham Police Detective Division and the patrol division has led to the arrest of 21 year old Ryan Foss of # 20 Wareham Lake Shore Dr. in East Wareham. He was arrested at the Traveller's Choice Motel, 3082 Cranberry Hwy. Wareham. Two others are being sought on felony arrest warrants.

Foss is charged with breaking into a residence in the Indian Mound Beach section of Wareham and stealing numerous pieces of jewelry, cameras, and other electronic items totaling nearly \$10,000.00. The homeowners reported the break when they arrived home to find a rear window on the house broken. The investigation also led to the recovery of an off-road four-wheeled quad valued at over \$7,000.00 that was stolen from the same area.

Detectives were led to Foss after locating several of the stolen items in a local jewelry store. He was arrested by Wareham Police on Dec. 1, 2009 and charged with Breaking and Entering a Building, Larceny from a Building, and Receiving Stolen Property Over \$250.00. He was arraigned the next morning at Wareham 4th District Court.

Nicole Petronelli, 23 and Brian Duffy, 28 are wanted by the Wareham Police Department for the same offenses. Their last known address is listed as 3082 Cranberry Highway Wareham, The Traveller's Choice Motel. Petronelli is described as a white female, 5' 5", 135 lbs., with brown eyes and brown hair. Duffy is described as a white male, 5' 10', 200 lbs., with brown hair and blue eyes. They are known to frequent the Taunton and New Bedford area.

Wareham Police are reaching out to the public for help in apprehending these two felons. Please call 508-295-1212 if you know their whereabouts.

Chief Richard Stanley commended his officers for their perseverance in solving this crime and returning all of the stolen items to their rightful owners.
